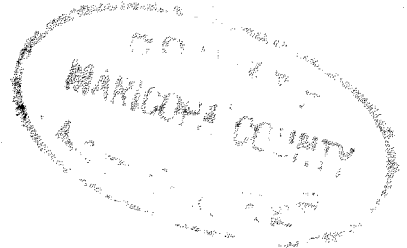

§ 1.1 *Secretary of the Treasury.* * * *

(b) * * * Pursuant to Executive Order No. 9809, December 12, 1946 (3 CFR, 1946 Supp.), there were transferred to the Secretary the functions of the Director of Contract Settlement and those functions of the Director of War Mobilization and Reconversion relating to supervision of the Office of Contract Settlement. [Sentence added Jan. 31, 1947, 12 F.R. 771]

(f) The Secretary of the Treasury is chairman or managing trustee of certain organizations in the nature of interdepartmental boards or committees. These offices are: * * * [Introductory text amended Jan. 31, 1947, 12 F.R. 771]

(4) *Contract Settlement Advisory Board.* Pursuant to the provisions of Executive Order No. 9809, December 12, 1946 (3 CFR, 1946 Supp.), the Secretary succeeded the Director of Contract Settlement as Chairman of the Contract Settlement Advisory Board, described in 32 CFR, 1946 Supp., 8095.4. § 1.2 *Under Secretary.* * * *

There have been assigned to his supervision the activities of the Bureau of Internal Revenue, the Bureau of Customs, the Office of the Technical Staff, the Division of Tax Research, and the United States Savings Bonds Division. [Last sentence amended Nov. 7, 1947, 12 F.R. 7326]

§ 1.3 *Assistant Secretaries.* * * *

§ 1.4 *General Counsel (a)* * * *

§ 1.6 *Assistants to the Secretary.*

§ 1.7 *Special Assistants to the Secretary.* By Treasury Department Order No. 88, July 10, 1947, a Special Assistant to the Secretary, reporting directly to the Secretary, shall perform such functions and duties as may be assigned from time to time. (R.S. 161, 60 Stat. 237; 5 U.S.C. 22, 1001 et seq.) [Statement, Aug. 11, 1947, 12 F.R. 5460]

§ 1.12 *Office of International Finance.* (a) The Office of International Finance was established by Treasury Department Order No. 86, July 10, 1947, which abolished the Division of Monetary Research and transferred to the Office of International Finance Foreign Funds Control and the functions, duties, and personnel of the Division of Monetary Research. The Office is headed by a Director, who is appointed by and reports directly to the Secretary. There are three Assistant Directors, one of whom serves as Director of Foreign Funds Control. For description of the organization and functions of Foreign Funds Control, see Part 138 of this title.

§ 1.12 *Office of International Finance.* (a) The Office of International Finance was established by Treasury Department Order No. 86, July 10, 1947, which abolished the Division of Monetary Research and transferred to the Office of International Finance Foreign Funds Control and the functions, duties, and personnel of the Division of Monetary Research. The Office is headed by a Director, who is appointed by and reports directly to the Secretary. There is a Deputy Director who assists the Director in discharging
